

#### Price Bulletin #5a for Selected Legumes, Roots & Tubers, and other Cereals

**FEBRUARY 2021** 



This price bulletin was developed by researchers at IFPRI Malawi with the goal of providing clear and accurate information on the variation of weekly retail prices of selected agricultural commodities that are important for food security and nutrition in Malawi. The reports are intended as a resource for those interested in agricultural markets in Malawi.

# **Highlights**

- Average retail prices for common beans and pigeon peas increased by 5 to 9 percent while soybean and groundnut retail prices remained stable.
- Average retail prices of cassava decreased by 31 percent, Irish potato increased by 25 percent while sweet potato retail prices remained constant.
- Rice retail prices increased by 25 percent while sorghum retail prices remained constant.

Figure 1. Regional average retail prices (MWK/unit) of cassava, Irish potato, and sweet potato during February 2021





# How data was collected

With financial support from the European Union, IFPRI Malawi began monitoring retail prices of selected legumes, roots and tubers, and non-maize cereals\* in selected markets in October 2020. Currently, prices are collected from 44 markets across the country, with monitoring occurring once per week. Three monitors report prices from each market. Data is collected by means of automated short message service (SMS) with follow-ups made by telephone the next day if needed. The commodities monitored were phased-in, starting with legumes, root crops and other cereals, and then expanding to include livestock products and fish by the end of 2020. Note that the number of markets monitored vary by commodity because major markets are targeted in areas where these commodities are widely produced.
